



HACU's Legislative Agenda

As part of HACU's Legislative Agenda, we advocate for:

- Equitable funding for HSIs
- Increasing authorization levels for Title V Part A and B
- Reauthorization of the Farm Bill with increased funding and inclusion of select HSIs in the Land Grant community.
- Immigration reform, particularly the passage of the DREAM Act
- Enhancing the Pell Grant by doubling the award amount and extending eligibility for DACA and TPS students
- Establishing a capital financing program for HSI infrastructure
- Passage of the HERE Act

Institute for Professional Leadership

Leadership Academy/La Academia De Liderazgo

Prepares executive level higher education administrators at colleges and universities for top leadership roles at Hispanic-Serving Institutions, emerging HSIs and other institutions of higher learning. The one-year fellowship program includes webinars and three seminars.

HACU Scholarship Program

The Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) is pleased to be the administrator of scholarship opportunities provided by our partners. These scholarships can help students cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, and other expenses (varies by scholarship).

Eligibility:

- Are currently enrolled at a HACU-member institution in the U.S. or Puerto Rico;
- Have graduated from a high school (or have earned a high school equivalency diploma) in the U.S. or Puerto Rico;
- Have completed your first-semester of college at a HACU-member institution; and intend to enroll at a HACU-member institution.
- Demonstrate financial need if required by the scholarship sponsor (typically determined by the FAFSA or State/Institutional Aid);

Application Timeline:

- Fall and Spring scholarship cycle. New scholarships are added throughout the academic year, so remember to check back regularly.
- Students can build their scholarship profile today and our system will automatically match them with HACU scholarships.

Scholarship Benefits:

- Financial assistance to help students cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, and other expenses (varies by scholarship).
- Leadership Development Opportunities (i.e. sponsorship to attend Adelante Leadership Institute, varies by scholarship)
- Certain scholarships are renewable.
