  - a. Welcome & Introductions – see chat
- II. Review and Adoption of Meeting Agenda and Approval of 3/4/22 Meeting Minutes
  - a. Meeting agenda approved

- III. Update: [Perkins Report](#)
  - a. Only up to 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter is being reported
  - b. Report does not capture stipends going out at the end of the semester, so actual expenditures may be higher than reflected in this report

- i. Suggestion: the messaging is important – the District can demonstrate an understanding of this. An ongoing dialogue between colleges and district needs to occur.
  - 1. A greater understanding around anticipated expenditures is needed – it would be beneficial if the district did know this.
- ii. Upcoming Perkins work plan (comprehensive local needs assessment CLNA) – what is the status at the District? (District-wide data questions); Carmen is working with coordinator to gather data for this, is in the data-gathering process
  - 1. Concern: if plans are submitted by due date, is the district prepared to submit CLNA?

IV. Update: Strong Workforce Program

- a. [Expenditure Report](#) – linked to chat; emailed as well
- b. Reporting Timeline
  - i. Question: What is the District doing to ensure deadlines are being met?
    - 1. District Finance says colleges must meet with the CBO's.
    - 2. Question: What is the District doing to support the colleges to ensure that reporting deadlines are met? The colleges need the support of the District. Working solely with CBO's is not enough.
      - a. Let District Finance know if any systems are needed from them? Yes.
      - b. Must follow up with District Finance. Albert can help escalate to upper management if they are being unresponsive.
        - i. Escalation to Dr. Droker should already happen.
      - c. Discrepancies lie with the District as they are truly out of the control of the CBO. There are specific things that only the District Office can do. College's reporting is based on the accuracy of the District Finance reports. Issues in carryovers; challenges in loading funds in different account lines; colleges need the District to fix these issues.
      - d. Yes: discrepancies need to be corrected in District Finance; once FY is closed, there is no way Finance can open to amend; use comments field in NOVA to note past corrections
      - e. Working on the issues must start with the grantee
    - 3. BCC did follow up with District Finance (journals were done), but nothing happened after that. District AA is who tells the BACCC what the allocations are. Running reports out of NOVA are not accurate. District has not given BACCC any current adjusted allocation numbers.
    - 4. Once allocation is received for a round, use the FTES to determine allocation. Submit this to BACCC using their allocation form. BACCC enters this into their system. Colleges do their budget

projections in NOVA, generate a report to match NOVA entries (budget projection) to allocation. AA submits updated budget allocation again.

- a. Carryover was not added to current round (FIFO)
- b. Email on 3/18 regarding BCC discrepancies on allocation was not addressed – Albert will follow up
- ii. Recurring issues – what proactive measures are taken to resolve them? Is a work group needed? Shared document detailing a list of issues needing help? Needs to be solutions-focused.
  1. District Finance already informed Albert they can work 1-1 with colleges to help correct budgets. Albert will follow up with them.
    - a. Not enough to work 1-1: the money comes to the district collectively, then allocated out collectively. Some issues need to be fixed as a collective, beginning with how allocations are disbursed.
  2. CE Deans collectively putting together district-wide concerns/challenges, then specific college concerns, then shared with VPIs. A feeling of nothing is happening.
- c. R6 SWP Plans/Budgets in NOVA
- d. Status of SWP Fiscal Reports
- e. CTE Enrollment Comparison
  - i. Question: how are we going to capture, going forward, the grant-funded classes that were not captured (not D), grant funded? How to capture that data? Last meeting, Dr. Droker said if there was going to be a change in the funding process, it needed to go through shared governance (currently funding is based on CTE classes) – what is the process the district is requesting to change shared governance? How are we going back and capturing the data on how many sections were run on grant funding in the CTE programs? HERF funding/pandemic funding in the past 2 years?
    1. Goes back to the coding: SAM ABCD; grant funds coded as SAM X; if changes made to SAM ABCD – go back to shared governance. Topic brought up to DAASC.
      - a. Change to coding has to go to curriculum committee (not a fast change) – even if every class that received grant funds was changed to D allocation, it's still not going to get counted as CTE allocation classes
        - i. Must get academic senate to approve SAM CODE D to count for CTE Funding to count for SWP and Perkins
        - ii. Official request to academic senate: a resolution; but a slippery slope – changes to curriculum is faculty driven, not by district admin; hearing that they are being told that faculty need to change

curriculum to receive funding, but this develops bad precedent.

1. Clarification: grant funded courses in the past were coded using SAM ABCD X;
  - b. Suggestion: pull back on coding; the VPs, deans, schedulers – purpose of meeting is to support each other, get things done, shift burdensome systems – Albert to provide preliminary reports 1-2 weeks prior to meetings to each college to allow time for discrepancies, issues, and work to provide projections to capture the work being done in advance.
    - i. Can send out reports 1 week prior
    - ii. Suggestion: prior to coming to CE Deans, reports are sent to VPIs for review first so they are prepared for meeting with Deans.
- V. CE Liaison Report-Out (Accomplishments, Opportunities, Challenges/Issues)
- a. BCC: first regional advisory committee for virtual production academy (RJV) – way to collectively create a bachelors degree for virtual production, including video and multi media (5 schools working together); lead fiscal school is DVC; hoping to move forward by vote to create articulation between the big 10 and then to create the VP associates degree, bachelors degree, and opportunities to develop apprenticeship programs. Advisory meeting had 11 different companies participate.
  - b. COA: career discovery day 4/29 – students have opportunity to view CE programs. Collaboration between FabLab and aviation maintenance technology program – FabLab helped students make propellers as a learning tool.
  - c. Laney: CTE expo 4/23 – working with curriculum committee: 99/159 (63%) are CTE; biggest concerns: FTEF allocations given out across the colleges were at reduced levels, impacted a lot of programs. Lots of concerns about machines now sitting idle because decreased allocations prohibit frequent offering of classes. Many went to the Board to raise this issue. Wants to revisit allocations. Attended state CE liaison meeting with Mary Clarke-Miller.
  - d. Merritt: Advocacy day; histology – big at CCCAOE – a lot of interest and opportunities to plant program in Sacramento and San Jose; next week is Feather’s site visit; new job – digital pathology technician – is coming

    - i. Already a non-credit CCCApply application (no response yet from help desk with direct link)
    - ii. Non-credit webpage is live/working

1. Contracted Suzan May, worked with curriculum chair specialists to receive updated programs, verified with CE liaisons, and updated existing template to print folders. Helpful to know how much the District does have to spend so college can then make recommendations. Don't want to duplicate efforts.
  2. When Marie left District, they were establishing district-wide campaign for CE. May be worthwhile to continue doing this if there are funds available. Even contract someone who can conduct a marketing analysis, local needs assessment
    - a. collaborate with Mark Johnson
    - b. How much can be used out of 0035? Albert to provide this at the next CE meeting
    - ii. Developing new district-wide CE posters
    - iii. Possible funding sources
  - d. SWP Rounds 1-4 Final Reporting
    - i. Programmatic and fiscal
    - ii. District support (AA/Finance) - suggestions
      1. District to update BACCC with the allocation numbers. For R1-4.
- VII. Other Matters, Q&A, Announcements
- a. CCCAOE
  - b. Spring Plenary AB 705 – push everyone beyond transfer-level English & Math courses.
  - c. AB 1705 summary of discussion
    - i. Concerned about people placing themselves too low; lots of discussion; lots of effort put into support
    - ii. Resolutions all passed (not unanimously)
    - iii. Not sure how this will impact CTE programs. Many have built-in specific math classes (math for lab scientists not a transfer level math; kept it contextualized); now CID descriptors written to solve issue (no longer just contextualized)
    - iv. Huge detriment to CE by demanding everyone take a transfer-level math/English course. Would lose a lot of CE students; almost bypasses all of CE.
      1. Large for-profit 4-year organizations are lobbying for this
  - d. Strong Workforce K12 (AB2058): Do away with SWP K12. Against this because:
    - i. Taken a lot of work to partner with K12s; funds managed by chancellor's office and forced K12 to dialogue with colleges. This would be undone if SWP K12 was eliminated.
  - e. CE Liaison funds needs to be posted as a job description
  - f. Recommendation: for Local needs assessment: District explore idea of contracting with West Ed or other similar agency to conduct data analysis for CE. They did a phenomenal job for San Diego district and capacity to do it quickly
    - i. "Comprehensive local needs assessment questions" – details what kind of data to be collected
