






Discover your community at BCC



MENTAL HEALTH AMBASSADOR PROGRAM



All Social Work & Human Services students are encouraged to apply to the Mental Health Ambassador program, a paid, work-based learning experience.

I was a full time teacher, taking online courses at BCC from Singapore for 1.5 years. I am taking my prerequisites at BCC to major in Chemistry at a UC.

I started learning about mental health because of the coup in Myanmar, where I am from. They say that everybody comes to this program because of a calling, and I really relate to that sentence.





Before the coup, I didn't really have any knowledge or interest in mental health. But when the coup broke out, I was still in Singapore, and I wanted to learn how to help people in my country. So I started taking counseling courses and first aid mental health courses at BCC.

Everyone needs this kind of training, everyone faces struggles—not just you, but the people around you, as well. The training I have received here really helps me when my friends come to me for emotional support. I don't get as emotionally affected, myself, and can help them.

Becoming a Mental Health Ambassador has been really humbling. It's really about learning to trust and rely on your community, and to give back. It's made my stay here a lot more meaningful. We all come from such different backgrounds—a lot of us are non-traditional students. Learning about their experiences has really changed my perspective.
