

To Mr. Cambra and the Public:

On August 5, 2023, Member Cambra sent a letter to Mr. Crawley in his capacity as Chair of the Peralta Community College District (PCCD) Bond Measures Oversight Committee (BMOC) detailing certain procedural inconsistencies with the Brown Act's remote attendance rules. Specifically, Mr. Cambra highlighted that two members of the committee attending the July 2023 meeting did not have both audio and video on as required, and that the members attending remotely did not state the "just cause" required by the Brown Act to attend remotely either in the meeting or in the minutes from the meeting.

In order to avoid unnecessary litigation and without admitting any violation of the Ralph M. Brown Act, the Peralta BMOC hereby unconditionally commits that it will cease, desist from, and not repeat the challenged past action as described above.

The Peralta BMOC may rescind this commitment only by a majority vote of its membership taken in open session at a regular meeting and noticed on its posted agenda as "Rescission of Brown Act Commitment." You will be provided with written notice, sent by any means or media you provide in response to this message, to whatever address or addresses you specify, of any intention to consider rescinding this commitment at least 30 days before any such regular meeting. In the event that this commitment is rescinded, you will have the right to commence legal action pursuant to [subdivision \(a\) of Section 54960 of the Government Code](#). That notice will be delivered to you by the same means as this commitment, or may be mailed to an address that you have designated in writing.
