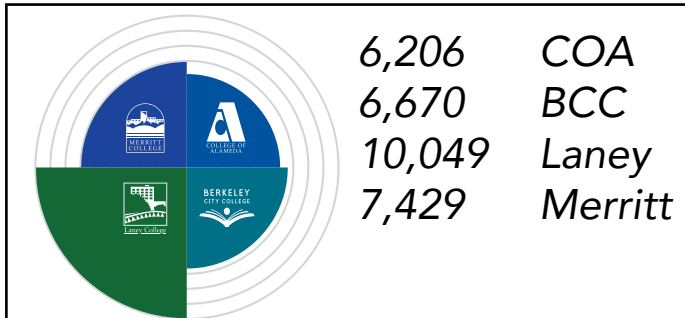

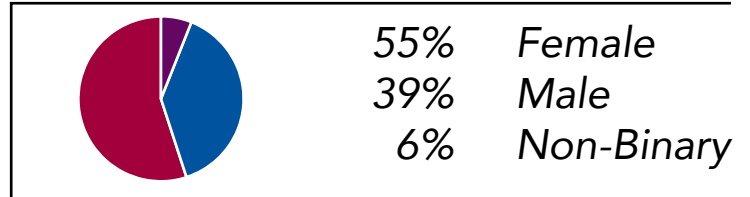

STUDENT HEADCOUNT

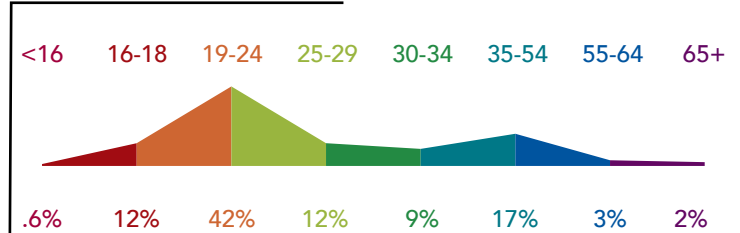

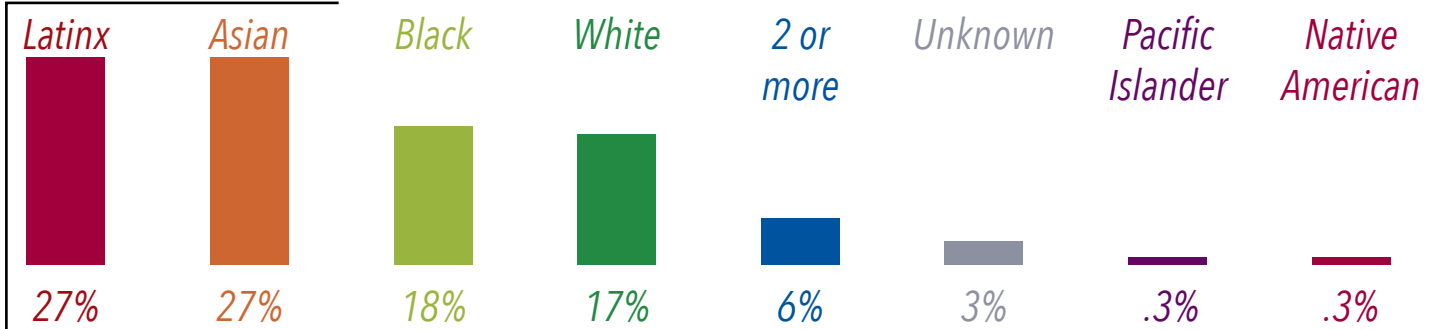
GENDER

- A completed **Peralta Community College District application**
- A **cover letter** expressing interest in the opportunity and how your knowledge and expertise relate to the position and the Desirable Qualifications: Desired Qualities, Competencies, and Commitments described above (not to exceed 5 pages).
- **Current resume** including educational background, professional experience, professional activities, and other relevant information.
- **8-10 current professional references** (names, mobile and business telephone numbers, email addresses) including 2 supervisors, 2 direct reports, 2 faculty members, 2 classified professionals, and 2 community leaders who have worked with you, preferably in the last 5 years.
- **Copies of transcripts** must be submitted with the application. If an employment offer is extended, official transcripts must be provided.
