College of Alameda Educational Master Plan (EMP) Updates

Professor Jody Campbell will assemble information and write CoA's Educational Master Plan. He has already begun writing the document that will reflect the College's collective work, vision, and caring spirit.

CoA's College Council will serve as the Steering Committee for the EMP process.

Several teams worked during winter break to research and analyze the Environmental Scan Analysis prepared and presented by the <u>West Ed team</u>, the completed State Education Agency (SEA) Plan, SWOT Analysis data, and other planning documents. The teams presented their work during the College's well-attended January Flex Day. The teams collected feedback and recommendations and continue to meet weekly to refine the findings, goals, and identified main priorities and strategic goals for the College community.

CoA Partners with A Better Chance (ABC)

On Saturday, February 4, 2023, the College of Alameda EOPS/CARE/Cal WORKs/ Next Up Program, SALAAM Learning Community, and <u>A Better Chance (ABC)</u> held a joint event introducing an exciting new partnership between the College of Alameda (CoA) and ABC. This partnership will help promote concurrent enrollment at CoA to prospective students affiliated with ABC, a national nonprofit organization.

Despite the rain, over 100 people and their extended families attended the two-part event. Many participants came from Oakland, Alameda, Marin, Walnut Creek, Berkeley, or San Leandro.

CoA held a special session introducing families to the College's robust concurrent enrollment opportunities and special support services for high school students, including EOPS/CARE/Cal WORKs/ Next Up, SALAAM Learning Community, Adult Education, ESOL Classes, and Career Technical Education programs. CoA counselors also provided registration assistance and counseling. Later in the afternoon, ABC held a Bay Area alumni reception, attended by **50 ABC alumni,** where alumni also were introduced to CoA's various programs and services.

Since 1963, the ABC program has been the preeminent resource for identifying, recruiting and developing leaders among underrepresented young people of color throughout the United States. The oldest and only national organization of its kind, ABC selects, prepares, places, and supports high-performing middle and high school students of color in some of the most rigorous and prestigious independent day schools, boarding schools and public schools in the country.
