# Over 60,000 Attend the City of Alameda's 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade

The 46th Annual City of Alameda's 4th of July Parade, titled The Island's Independence Celebration, is reportedly the longest in the nation with a route that spans over three miles. College of Alameda was one of 170 entries in this year's event. CoA President **Dr. Diana Bajrami** and PCCD Trustee **Bill Withrow** rode in an antique car and were among 2,500 parade participants. This popular parade drew a crowd of over 60,000 spectators from around the Bay Area and boasted a variety of fun entries, including equestrians, dance troops, floats, antique cars, community groups, and marching bands, from community members, organizations, local schools, and more.
