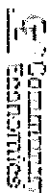

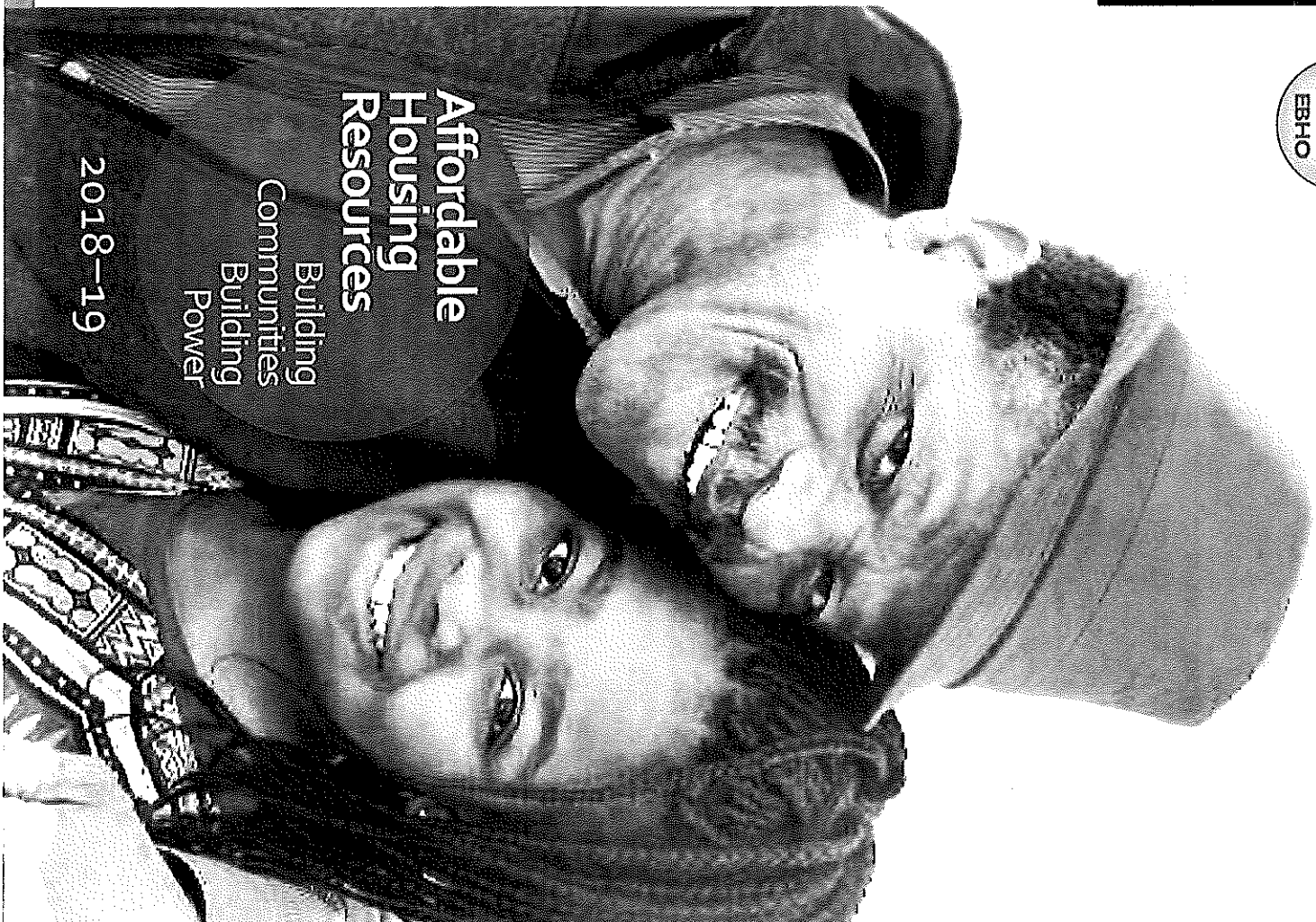
EBHO's Mission

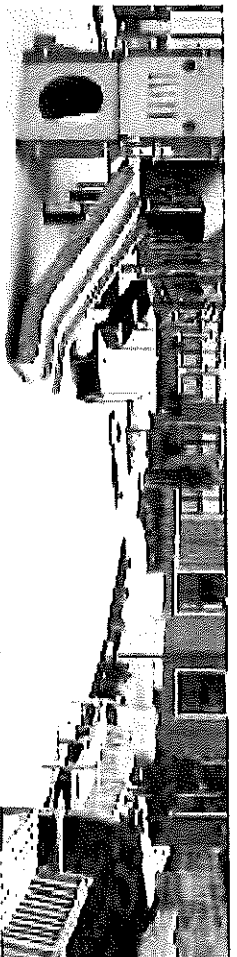

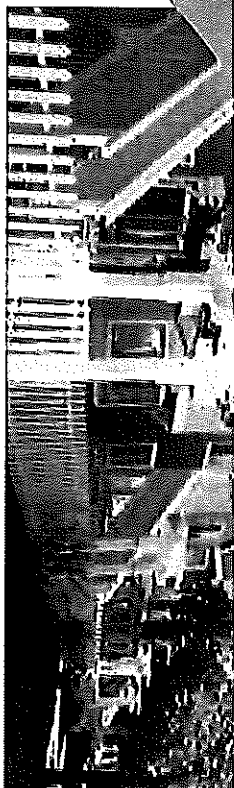

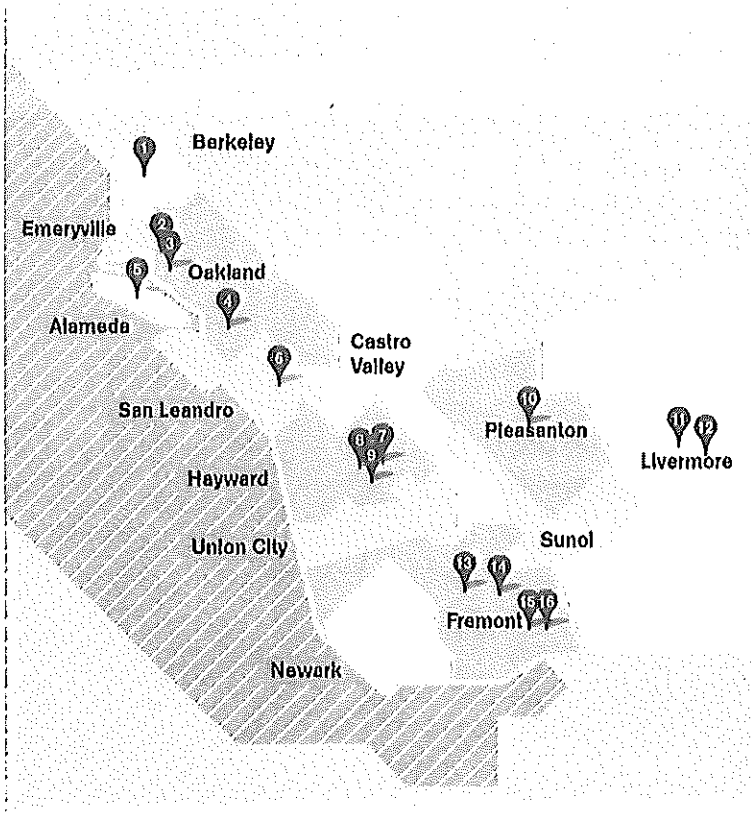

If you're currently HOMELESS drop-in to a Housing Resource Center (HRC):



What to expect when you contact a Housing Resource Center (HRC):

- Staff will problem-solve with you to identify any immediate solutions to your housing crisis and conduct a 30-minute assessment of your needs. Your information is confidential and used only to connect you with housing or services.
- Housing and shelter are very limited. Staff will explain if there is anything available for you, and if not, how to stay in touch. Staff will contact you if something becomes available.
- Keep your info updated. Stay in touch and keep your info updated. Let your HRC know if anything changes like your location, contact information, housing, health, or family situation. You can go to your HRC's drop-in hours or leave updates on your HRC's message line.

We believe that everyone should have a home. Since our founding in 1989, Abode Services has grown from a small organization sheltering a few dozen people in the city of Fremont to a regional agency offering innovative, successful housing programs and services for more than 9,100 people each year in Alameda, Santa Clara, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, and Napa counties.

We are a nationally recognized leader in evidence-based strategies for ending homelessness for those most in need, using approaches such as Housing First, rapid rehousing, and supportive housing. We partner with local cities and counties to place people experiencing homelessness into housing and help them maintain that housing by connecting them to supportive services.

We administer or assist dozens of programs, through which we've helped thousands of children, families, veterans, transitional-age youth, chronically homeless individuals, and low-income people.

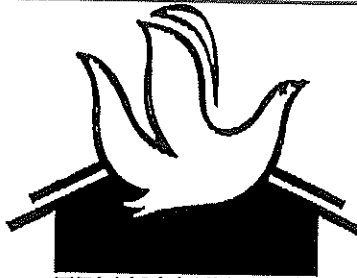
o **Literal Homelessness: Sleeping in Car or outside**

1. Individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, meaning:
 - Has a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not meant for human habitation
 - Is living in a publicly or privately-operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (**including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state, and local government programs**); or
 - Is exiting an institution where (s)he has resided for 90 days or less and who resided in an emergency shelter or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution

 2. Any individual or family who:
 - **Is fleeing, or is attempting to flee, domestic violence.**
 - **Has no other residence; and**
 - **Lacks the resources or support networks to obtain other permanent housing**
- o **Disability** – The head of household has a disabling health condition(s) that is expected to be of long-continued and indefinite duration and substantially impedes the persons' ability to live independently, such as a diagnosable substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability, or chronic physical illness or disability.
- o **Are over 18 or Emancipated Youth.**
- o **Currently Reside in Alameda County**

This is the automated application phone line. When you call, you should have 15 – 20 minutes to complete the application in full. You will not be speaking with a live person but rather moving through recorded prompts and if you end the call any time before the end, your data won't be collected, and you'll have to start over the next time you call.

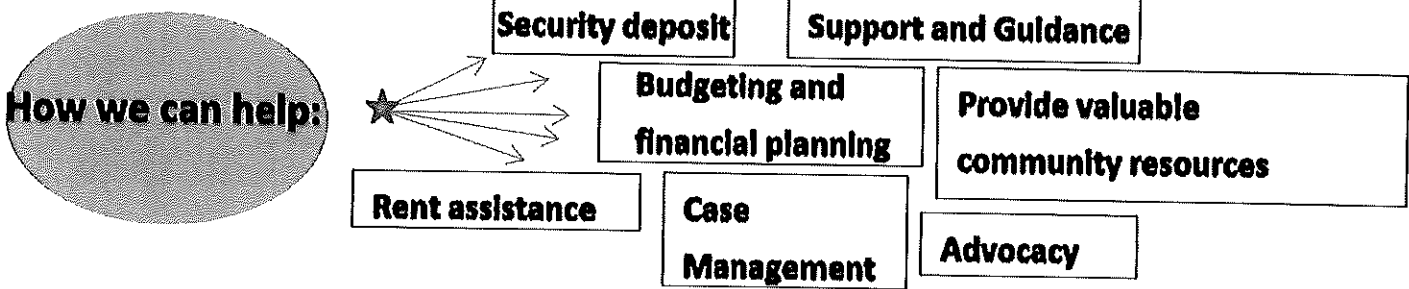

Linkages Housing Program

The Linkages Housing Program is an accelerated *one-year* subsidized housing program geared to helping homeless families find permanent housing and achieve financial self-sufficiency.

Families will work one-on-one with a Linkages Case Manager that will guide them through the necessary steps to obtain and retain permanent housing and get back on their feet.



The Linkages subsidy gradually decreases financial rental assistance in scheduled phases that allow the participant to build towards self-sufficiency.

Phase:	Expectation:
1. Rent for months 1-3	Participant will pay 40% of their monthly income.
2. Rent for months 4-6	Participant will pay 30% of their monthly income or contracted rent
3. Rent for months 7-9	Participant will pay 50% of their monthly income or contracted rent.
4. Rent for months 10-12	Participant will pay 70% of their monthly income or contracted rent.
5. Completion of 12 months	Program graduation! Participant will pay 100% of their rent and transition fully off the subsidy.
