


President's Report to the PCCD Board of Trustees

Laney Enjoys Increased Summer, Fall 2024 Enrollments

With the Summer 2024 semester underway, the College is pleased to share that enrollment numbers are high despite reductions in scheduling. Though Summer Schedule is 6% smaller than last year's, the College is enjoying 4% growth from a year ago in enrollment and 3% more resident Full Time Equivalent student numbers. Classes are full, at productivity levels well above the 17.5; in fact, as of June 12, it was 18.19, or more than 36 students per section. Many thanks to the outreach efforts of colleagues as well as the work of staff, faculty, and administrators.

Fall is also showing growth with 9% more students, 8% more enrollments and full sections in Career Education sections that include Carpentry, Welding, Culinary Arts, and Machine Technology as well as Cosmetology. As Laney moves into the Fall semester, it looks forward to welcoming students and the community to continue enrolling and stands ready to provide support, especially through events such as our August 10 and 17 One Stop Saturdays, held on campus from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.
