#### Laney CalWORKs




The Laney CalWORKs office has been busy advancing our mission of providing opportunities for our students. Early last year, the CalWORKs Association received a large grant from Blue Shield of California to provide training and coaching for students to partake in redesigning policy that affects CalWORKs families across the state. We call these students SPARC (Student Parents Reimagining CalWORKs)

This year marked the culmination of this

preparation, and our very own student Joy Perrin has led the effort in conjunction with the Western Center on Law and Poverty, and she has been in weekly meetings with our state senators' offices to stop the proposed 1 billion budget cuts to the family stabilization program for CalWORKs families. We can refer our students to the family stabilization program when they have housing insecurities. This program is designed to match participants with housing vouchers and more stable options. The proposed cut will eliminate this service; our CalWORKs students nationwide have been working hard to stop that.


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#### Book Talk – Nature Swagger
