### **Clean Slate Event Offers Support to Present, Future Students**

On May 7th, 2024 Laney College's Restoring Our Communities (ROC) Program hosted a Criminal Records Relief event, partnering with four legal organizations: Alameda County Public Defender's Office Clean Slate Program, East Bay Community Legal Center, Root & Rebound and Legal Aid at Work. Designed to help both formerly incarcerated Laney College ROC students and local community members, record relief is an important remedy to various barriers to employment, housing and more.

Since 2018, ROC has partnered with Clean Slate of Alameda County to remedy hundreds of records for students and has now added more partners to respond to a growing need. These events are much more than referrals and warm hand-offs-- they have become on-site clinics where students speak directly to an attorney and receive a legal service specific to their experience. These partnerships would be impossible without the continued support from both the Peralta Board of Trustees and the Alameda County Board of Supervisors.



### Laney College CTE Rocks the (Open) House



On Saturday, April 29th, Laney College hosted its Annual Career and Technical Education (CTE) Open House. It was a celebration of possibilities as we opened our doors to showcase the transformative power of Career and Technical Education programs where passion meets purpose, and dreams find their wings. Faculty across a myriad of disciplines, staff from the three divisions of the College, President Besikof, Vice President Opsata, and Trustees Quindlen and Gonzales Brito we among those on hand, with opening remarks provided by President Besikof and Raya Zion with the Employment Services Center

Over 400 potential students, parents, and community partners were in attendance. In addition, 10 industry and community partners, including labor unions, tabled to demonstrate how our certificates and degrees lead to fulfilling careers. With about 100 Laney College employees supporting the event, students were able to register on the spot. Over the weekend, Laney College gained 240 new students and 537 seat enrollments for the Fall 2024 semester. We also gained 225 new students and 316 seat enrollments for the Summer 2024 session.


