On Monday, February 26, Merritt College welcomed students to our Love-Moss Center for Re-Entry and Empowerment for the opportunity to receive free post-conviction legal services. Under the auspices of The Access Project (TAP), and the leadership of COSER Department Chair Biancca Parazo, students received assistance with everything from navigating the expungement/dismissal and felony reduction process, to learning how approach the final hearing of their case. The program provides these services for free, and the fees associated with record collection and court filings are covered as well. Needless to say, providing these resources are critical if we are to meet our Mission to Put Students First. Justice-Impacted students have particular needs and challenges, but we are committed to ensuring that we provide them the necessary support to pursue any and every educational avenue that we have at the College.




As Black History Month comes to a close, I am pleased to share two items of note. Merritt College represented well at the 2024 Black College Expo held at the Oakland Convention Center on February 17. Given the critical role that we want to play in student transfer to four-year institutions, we felt that it was

important to let attendees know that we can provide a road map to the HBCU of their choice (saving them and their families thousands of dollars along the way). I should also share that we are working on establishing a formal agreement with Alabama A&M University, an

HBCU located in Huntsville (more on that soon). In an effort to reach students who have already applied to Merritt College but did not enroll, as well as those who were once enrolled but "stopped out," Merritt faculty, staff, and administrators are coming together to initiate a phone outreach campaign. With a call sheet of more than 350 students, our goals are to get them registered for Summer/Fall courses, assist them with any issues pertaining to Financial Aid, A&R, Counseling, etc., make them aware of the resources available to them through college in general and our Sankofa Program in particular, and establish an ongoing connection that will support their retention.





In closing, we are pleased to announce that on May 3, 2024, Merritt College will host the inaugural Peralta Community College District Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) Graduation! You may recall that last year Laney and BCC collaborated to put on a joint celebration in recognition of their status as AANAPISI (Asian American Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution) Grantees. Merritt College is proud to join our sister colleges in attaining this status (the most recent data show that our percentage for this student demographic is approaching 18%--to be eligible

for AANAPISI status, an institution's student enrollment must be at least 10%), and this event will both underscore and inspire our collective comment to support this student population. The event will be held in the Newton-Seale Room from 5pm to 7pm, and we are expecting at least 200 attendees. We look forward to celebrating with you!
