207 INTRODUCTION:

208 This document contains updates to PCCD disciplines list, and sorted alphabetically by PCCD subject
209 codes with addition of the relevant discipline from “2023 Minimum Qualifications for Faculty and
210 Administrators in California Community Colleges” separated by “/” in case they differ.

211 TYPES OF UPDATES:

212 “Multi Disciplines”

213 At PCCD curriculum management platforms such as Peralta Campus Solutions (CS) System And
214 CurriQunet, the word “subject” is used to group courses share the same relevant discipline except in
215 some cases courses that are placed under the same subject code can be assigned to different disciplines,
216 those are in RED for further review and confirmation with a notation “Multi Disciplines”

217 “Different assigned discipline to the same subject code”

221 GOAL OF UPDATE

222 The goal of this update is to review assigning courses to disciplines (course Designation) to ensure
223 faculty have the appropriate minimum qualifications necessary to teach each current active course in
224 PCCD.

225

226 THIS DOCUMENT SHOULD BE UPDATED IN THE FOLLOWING CASES:

- 227 1. Update mandated by the Minimum Qualifications for Faculty and Administrators in California
228 Community Colleges handbook that might impact PCCD disciplines list
- 229 2. Update to PCCD disciplines list requested by any of Peralta colleges such as adding a new subject
230 code/discipline.

234 NOTE REGARDING CREDIT VS NONCREDIT:

235 At PCCD both credit and noncredit courses are placed under the same relevant subject code even
236 though the minimum qual can be different.

237 For example: noncredit Math and credit Math courses are assigned to “MATH” subject code with “Multi
238 Disciplines” which means if a college hires a faculty to teach only noncredit MATH course based on the
239 minimum qual required for teaching noncredit MATH. Once hired, that faculty will have access in
240 “Student Administration system” (SA) to teach any course assigned to “MATH” credit or noncredit, as a
241 result, that hiring college must maintain a manual list of faculties who are hired to teach only noncredit
242 course to ensure they would not be able to teach any credit MATH courses.

243

244 EXCERPT FROM FAQs ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS (MQS)

245 *Q: Who has the responsibility for establishing and maintaining the Disciplines List and*
246 *enforcing the regulations relating to the MQs?*

247 *A: The Academic Senate for California Community Colleges, in conjunction with the*
248 *Chancellor’s Office, shares that responsibility. The Academic Senate is responsible for*
249 *reviewing and revising the Disciplines List. A list of Academic Senate papers on minimum*
250 *qualifications and the Disciplines List is included at the end of this document. An overview of the*

253 *Q: Isn’t the course designation under the TOP code the same as the disciplines in the*
254 *Disciplines List?*

255 *A: No. Colleges need to be cautious that the course designation under the Taxonomy of*
256 *Programs (TOP) is not confused with the Disciplines List developed in establishing MQs*
257 *for faculty to meet when being hired for a position. TOP is a system of numerical codes*
258 *used at the state level to collect and report information on programs and courses in*
259 *different colleges throughout the state that have similar outcomes. It is used for*

260 *purposes other than identifying disciplines for the purposes of hiring and assignment of*
261 *faculty.*

262 *Q: Is it true that in order to teach a class placed within two or more disciplines that the*
263 *instructor only has to be qualified in ONE of the disciplines to teach it, not both?*

264 *A: Yes, if done properly. Some courses may be appropriately assigned to more than one*
265 *discipline. For example, a course entitled HIST 177 “Economic History of the United*
266 *States” may be appropriately placed in both the economics and history disciplines. The*
267 *discipline placement for HIST 177 could then be History OR Economics to indicate that a*
268 *faculty member with minimum qualifications in either discipline would be qualified to*
269 *teach this course, provided that he or she also possesses any additional qualifications*
270 *established by the governing board in conjunction with its academic senate. However, if*
271 *the discipline placement for HIST 177 is listed as History AND Economics, then the faculty*
272 *teaching this course must meet the MQs for both History and Economics. Therefore,*
273 *curriculum committees must exercise care in how they place courses within multiple*
274 *disciplines.*
