2. If not, what is the legal basis of his grievance?
3. If so, did member Cambra's July "request" email to me constitute the required demand letter?
4. Is Government Code §54960.2 the legal basis of your cease-and-desist letter to the BMOC?
5. If so, are you representing BMOC member Cambra in his right to pursue legal actions?
6. Does your cease-and-desist letter to the BMOC satisfy the requirement that BMOC member Cambra himself submit a cease-and-desist letter to the BMOC?
7. Would you be representing Peralta CCD in a legal action?

8. If so, has Peralta CCD performed the preliminary Government Code §54960.1 requirements?
9. If you file an action, who would be the Plaintiff/ Petitioner?
- 10.If you file an action, who would be the Defendants/ Respondents?
- 11.Will you recommend to Peralta CCD that it provide independent legal representation for the Defendants/ Respondents?
- 12.Will Peralta CCD provide independent legal representation for the Defendants/ Respondents?
